**Numeracy and Literacy**

Read and write whole numbers up to 1000  
 Arrange a set of three-digit numbers  
 Count forward/backward per 10, 100 of any two/three-digit number  
 Derive doubles from whole numbers up to 20, and matching halves  
 Close Doubles Derivation  
  
 Declaring a subtraction fact corresponding to an addition fact and vice versa  
 Count forward and backward by two.  
 Recognize odd/even numbers up to 100  
 Recall the multiplication facts in tables x2, x5 and x10 and derive division facts  
 Add and subtract the facts for each number up to 20  
 Memory pairs of multiples of 100 totaling 1000  
 Multiply numbers by 10
